Andrew probably moved from N. Fredericksburgh Township, Lennox and Addington County, Ontario, to nearby Prince Edward County early in 1822, the year his brother Rynard settled in the Burr Neighbourhood of Hillier Township. On May 15th of that year, Andrew, along with his two cousins named Isaac, was listed in the nominal returns of the 2nd Regiment of the Prince Edward Militia at Hallowell. In the fall of 1828, Andrew married Charity Lazier of Sophiasburgh Township. The young couple moved to N. Fredericksburgh Township and lived there the remainder of their lives. Andrew sold Lot 2 of the Third Concession of N. Fredericksburgh Township on 25 Apr. 1832. Andrew bought part of Lot 23 in the Seventh Concession of N. Fredericksburgh Township on 18 Mar. 1835. Later that year, Andrew, listed as a Fredericksburgh Township innskeeper, bought the west half of Lot 4 in the Eighth Concession of nearby Sheffield Township. It is doubtful if the family moved from their N. Fredericksburgh Township property. On 2 Mar. 1840, Andrew sold his Sheffield Township farm and bought part of the northwest quarter of Lot 24 of Concession Seven of N. Fredericksburgh Township. This last property was probably Andrew's principal residence and parts of it were sold in 1870, 1883 and 1885. In the meantime, Andrew also owned at various times parts of Lots 20 and 26 of the Seventh Concession of N. Fredericksburgh Township and Village Lots 11, 12, 33, and 52 of Clarksville, now part of Napanee. As well, Andrew owned both a tavern and a cording mill in Clarksville. By 1865 he had retired to his farm. In the various census he is referred to as a farmer, yeoman, or gentleman, and he and his family are listed as either Wesleyan or Episcopal Methodists. Andrew, Charity, their son Peter, and daughter Anna are all buried in the McCabe Community Cemetery in N. Fredericksburgh Township.

Rynard was one of the first settlers of Hillier Township, Prince Edward County, Ontario, settling in the Burr Neighbourhood about 1822. On 20 Feb. 1830 Rynard witnessed a land sale and was listed as a resident of Hillier Township. However, on Dec. 11th of that year, he witnessed the will of his cousin, Henry Snider. At that time he was living in Ameliasburgh Township, as he was when he married Martha Parliament on 17 Apr. 1833. As far as it is known, his children were born in Hillier Township, and he probably lived there from the time of his marriage until his death about 1845. Dr. W. K. Burr, Prince Edward County historian, claimed that Rynard gave the land for the Burr's Old United Empire Loyalist Burying Ground from his own Hillier Township farm. Burr claims that Rynard was Liberal in politics and that he and his family were members of the Church of the Disciples. Rynard and an infant son are buried there. Following his death, his widow married Peter Wannamaker.
